A special lunch on Saturday marked the inauguration of the elected officers to the National Executive Board where Fiona Lewis originally from Nenagh and representing Waterford Junior Chamber was appointed as Regional Development Director. Her role entails liaising with branches and members in the South Eastern area as well as helping new branches to start up - 'I would like to encourage young people to get involved in Junior Chamber, its great to work in a voluntary team with like-minded people and we have great fun too,' said Fiona.
